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Former Solheim Cup captain Mickey Walker with some advice to help you produce crisper chips around the greens

ONE of the most frustrating aspects of the game is a thinned chip when a par is beckoning. By using this two-coloured ball you can get used to the feeling of a firm wrist action, which is needed to execute this chip shot. Give it a try – it really will improve your ball striking



Plenty of amateurs fall into the trap of trying to scoop the ball up rather than letting the club do the work. You can see that my hips and chest have barely moved and the overuse of the hands have resulted in a thinned one with no control



Your set-up should have your weight on the left side with the hips open and hold the club slightly down the grip for better control. Get used to the feeling of the hips and left chest turning through the shot, thus eliminating too much wrist action



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
